## PREREGISTRATION IS REQUIRED FOR ALL RIDES IN ORDER TO GUARANTEE YOUR TENT SPACE.

The cost for the camp site will be \$5 per person per night for all participants.

## Ride Types

**Looped:** Also known as car camping. Drive or carpool to the chosen campground and put up your tent for the weekend. All Cream City rides start at the campground and loop back to the start.

**Self-contained:** Carry ALL your gear with you on the ride to the campground. Everything, clothing, tent, etc. you need for your self is contained on your bike. (No sags here!)

Load up your panniers (or BoB) and join your biking friends for a fall self contained group bike trip from Oconomowoc WI to the Dodge County Park at Astico WI located on the Bark River. It is an easy 20 mi ride to Watertown where we stop for an early lunch then bike the remaining 25 miles to the park. The ride is relaxed and we usually hit the park in the late afternoon with a couple hours of daylight left to cook dinner and visit. Sunday morning we head back through Watertown via a different route, stopping for lunch again before continuing on to Oconomowoc. The route back is a little hillier. If you are interested in trying a self-contained ride with some company, this would be an excellent opportunity. Be sure your equipment will hold up (racks stay attached etc...) and that you are up to riding with the extra weight. This is a group ride at a very leisurely pace. No one gets left behind. There's room on the site for approximately 8 -10 tents.
